EDITORIAL

What constitutes success?

The question comes to us at different points in our lives.

Doctors love to succeed, and like most Christian doctors, I wanted to succeed both professionally and spiritually. That was not a problem in itself. The problem was defining "success" and what it really meant to me.

Most secular definitions would include – achieving goals, making a major impact, having phenomenal influence and prospering both materially and character wise. It would include recognition from a large audience, at a fast and furious pace.

By all of the above standards, the life of Jeremiah was an utter failure. The introduction to the book of Jeremiah in the Life application Bible says that Jeremiah was:

- Desperately poor and underwent great deprivation;
- ❖ He had very few friends (20:10) as a result of prophesying against the authorities
- ❖ He was rejected by his neighbors (11:19-21)
- He was rejected by his family (12:6)
- ❖ He was rejected by the priests and the prophets (20:1, 2)
- He was rejected by the utterly indifferent religious audience.
- He seemed to be a depressive personality, who was constantly weeping over the fate of Israel.

The kings tortured him in a dungeon and he was taken to Egypt against his will. No one in the secular world would ever give him a prize for anything he had done or achieved.

Yet in God's eyes, Jeremiah was one of the most successful people in all of history. What was the reason? God's definition of success is radically different from ours.

I had to therefore relearn the definition of success – Success is obedience to God's Word and continuing perseverance, so that you not only begin well but finish well too.

POST CONFERENCE REPORT

ICMDA conferences have grown to become an essential fixture in the diaries of Christian medical students studying in Ukraine, medical educators and theologians from the world over!

This year, the conference attracted a total of 300 participants from over 28 countries. These countries included Ghana, Nigeria, Cameroun, India, Ukraine, Pakistan, Romania, Poland, Kenya, Libya, Morocco, Sudan and Congo. The rest were Canada, Australia, Iraq, Afghanistan, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Mauritius and Syria.

Over 50 participants were from other backgrounds.

medicine in other parts of the world and how a Christian medic could integrate them in day to day activities. The speakers came from the USA, England, Scotland, Czech Republic, Country of Georgia, Ukraine, Denmark and Sweden.



The conference was held in English but translations into Russian/Ukrainian were also provided for non-English speaking participants.

The Conference participants were delighted with the many speeches, presentations,

discussions and special networking events, which demonstrated a new mood of determination to innovate and improve learning for all. They described the event as "invigorating," "inspiring" and "exhilarating."

167 patients were operated on by Dr. Jany Haddad, president and founder of ACMA, with help and support from ACMA doctors and nurses both in Armenia and Nagorno-Karabagh.

ICMDA HIV INITIATIVE DESK

The "Dignity and Right to Health Award" is an activity of the International Christian Medical and Dental Association (ICMDA) Leadership in Christian Health and Development Initiative. It is an international award established to address health and development issues including HIV.

The committee this year had been challenged by the difficult task of choosing a winner for the 2012 award. All four nominations had more than adequately met the various criteria for the award. Finally, we chose to announce joint winners for the 2012 Dignity and Right to Health award of the ICMDA Leadership in Christian Health and Development Initiative.

Please join with us in celebrating the outstanding, inspiring and faithful Christian work of our joint winners, both from India - Drs Isac & Vijila David and Dr. Saira Paulose.

Drs Isac & Vijila David have clearly demonstrated visionary and innovative leadership from the time they graduated as family physicians, by stepping out in faith to take on a very difficult, yet rewarding role among a diminishing people group called Maltos in a very remote and neglected area in Jharkhand, India. On their exploration within the context of their call and vocation over fifteen years ago, they found the need to step in to change the course of life for these people.



Let me also introduce you to the wonderful work of Dr. Saira Paulose of India. She leads the SHALOM Delhi HIV/AIDS unit of the Emmanuel Hospital Association of India.



Dr. Saira through her quiet leadership has knit together a team which has significantly impacted many HIV-affected individuals and families, both directly and also indirectly through training of other organizations for home based care and other HIV-related interventions (including clinical care).

The majority of Shalom's home based care program beneficiaries are of migrant origin (neighbouring states) and live in poverty stricken communities in North West Delhi, Shalom's area of focus. Stigma and discrimination are still a very live issue, as attested to by case stories that continue to emerge from its work.

PROJECT

Anil Cherian, ICMDA South Sudan Team

Background: In August 2011 an ICMDA team led by Dr. Vinod Shah visited South Sudan to explore the possibility of ICMDA working towards supporting healthcare delivery in South Sudan. During this initial visit ICMDA was invited by the Ministry of Health, Government of South Sudan to start an Institute of Health Sciences in Bor, Jonglei State to train clinical officers and other health personnel, as there was a critical shortage of healthcare personnel in the country.

Dr. Vinod Shah made a second visit to South Sudan in January 2012 during which a Memorandum of Agreement was signed by the Ministry of Health, Government of South Sudan, the Episcopal Church of Sudan and ICMDA to start an Institute of Health Sciences and to second medical personnel to support the training needs of the Government of South Sudan.

The purpose of the third trip to South Sudan was to explore available resources for starting the Institute of Health Sciences in Bor but also to explore other alternative locations if starting the institute in Bor was not feasible.

The duration of the visit was from 7 -20 November 2012. Dr. Anil Cherian from India who was part of the earlier team, Dr. Jenny Bell a family physician from Canada who had worked for over a year in South Sudan with the Episcopal Church of South Sudan (ECS) and Dr. Alex Bolek, a physician from South Sudan who is also the General Secretary of Christian Medical Fellowship of South Sudan comprised the team..

The visit to Bor was very fruitful. The Governor of Jonglei State and the Minister of Health of the State have extended their full cooperation and support to ICMDA to start the institute. They are willing to provide the land at no cost to the ICMDA to locate the institute and are willing to raise some financial resources towards the construction of residences for students. There is a greater sense of ownership in Bor both by the State Government and the local medical doctors.

In Juba, I visited the National Health Training Institute, which trains nurses and midwives.

It was helpful to see their skills laboratories and to understand all the various aspects of managing a training institute and to interact with some of the faculty.

We have outlined a possible roadmap towards developing the institute over the next 5 years. We

also realize training different cadres of staff would have greater impact on the healthcare delivery and also on health outcomes.


ICMDA Eurasia Regional Secretary
